General Information

The Office of Juvenile System Oversight (OJSO) conducted a routine, announced visit on February 23, 2007, to the Eagle Springs Training Center, located in Skiatook, Oklahoma. The purpose of the visit was to assess compliance with established responsibilities. The program was licensed for ten residents by the Division of Child Care of the Department of Human Services (DHS). The facility had one resident on the day of the oversight visit. The Institute in Basic Life Principles (IBLP) operated the program that accepted only females.

Overview

Interviews

The resident and the one cabin leader were interviewed. No concerns were identified from the interviews.

Documentation Reviews

The case record on the resident was complete for all of the items reviewed, except for the custodian's participation in a six-month service plan review in June 2006. The development of the plan and subsequent reviews included the required participants. The personnel and training file of the cabin leader was complete for the items reviewed on the day of the visit.

The DHS Division of Child Care's inspection report noted an overdue physical examination. The correction was made prior to the OJSO visit. No other deficiencies were noted by the DHS licensing, the health department, or the fire marshal.

Observational Tour

The program utilized two-story log cabins as living quarters for the residents. One cabin was in use on the day of the visit. The cabin was clean and well-maintained. It was simple but attractively furnished and decorated. No issues of concern were identified from the tour.

Summary

The OJSO was advised that the program was not accepting new admissions. A three-year women's ministerial institute for high school graduates who were nineteen or older was established in lieu of the current program. The current resident had nearly completed the program and would soon be eighteen years of age.

The OJSO appreciated the helpfulness of the administration and the staff in arranging the interviews, conducting the inspection tour and in providing the necessary materials for the reviews.
